World Book Day: Friday 8th March

We are holding our World Book Day on Friday 8th March. The national Day is Thursday 7th March, nut we think it is more fun to have it on the last day of the week. We are celebrating World Book Day this year as we support the charity's mission to change lives through a love of books and reading.

We are inviting children **to dress up this World Book Day** as it's an exciting way for children to get book recommendations from each other. The book choice is key – even if it's just a prop or a clue, make sure your child is recommending something to read with their costume. We are aware that the cost-of-living crisis might make this difficult for some families, so we encourage you to use things you already have at home to make a creative costume. We would also greatly appreciate and welcome the donation of any of your children's old books (in a good condition) that they no longer require.

We'd love to include you in our celebrations by welcoming you to **come into school to share a book with your child at 2:45pm on this day.** This is a chance for you to become familiar with the books in our school, too. Further details to follow.

Reading books

We are very excited to be launching our new reading offer at St Matthew's as we aim to continue to promote a love of reading and further develop pupil skills in becoming independent readers. Research shows that children and young people who routinely read independently and for pleasure find learning in all subjects much easier. Reading also supports their communication skills- whether that is through speech or by another system.

We have recently purchased lots of new Oxford Owl reading texts for KS2 pupils that aim to offer our children a range of diverse and exciting reading material to enjoy at home. These include the following titles and genres:

- * Tree Tops Reflect- Emotionally powerful fiction and non-fiction to make children think.
- * TreeTops Chucklers- A variety of funny novels, short-story collections.
- * TreeTops Greatest Stories- A timeless collection to capture our literary heritage.
- * Infact- Powerfully engaging non-fiction titles to take KS2 beyond simple fact-finding. Compelling and imaginative non- fiction to engage children in reading for pleasure.

As a result of our new reading books, we wish to inform you that **if your child is in KS2, they will have had their current reading books collected in and returned to school this week.** Your child may be without their book band books for a week to give us some time to re-organise and re-distribute the children with the new books purchased. As well as this, we will be creating a school inventory of all the books in school that will include any existing books along with the new books added to our reading catalogue. This helps us to keep up to date with new releases and where appropriate purchase new texts and authors to continue to engage our children. It also helps us to keep a record of the books your children have read more easily.

Please bear with us as we spend time ensuring this transition process can be done as timely and smoothly as possible.

When these books are re-issued, the children will continue to enjoy reading books at their reading level and we are asking for your support in encouraging your child to read at home as much as possible. Please also make sure that your child brings these into school on a daily basis and that they are returned in good condition. Unfortunately, we are noticing lots of books being returned to school that have been scribbled on, with ripped pages and/or wet. Therefore, many of which have to be recycled and cannot be enjoyed by other pupils.

We would love for our new books to remain as new and exciting for as long as possible and thank you for your cooperation with this.

Thank you for your continued support, we look forward to you enjoying some of the new books with your children at home.
