Knowledge

- I know that a circuit needs to be complete for an electric current to flow.

Why do Christians call the day Jesus died Good Friday? (Digging Deeper)



- Pupils will know that Christians see Holy Week as the culmination of Jesus' earthly life, leading to his death and resurrection.
- Pupils will be able to say what each event of Holy week means for Christians today inc: Palm Sunday: washing disciples' feet at the Last Supper: Bread and wine at the Last Supper; Judas' betrayal; Peter's denial; the Crucifixion; the Resurrection.
- Pupils know that most Christians believe that Jesus rose from the dead and so is alive today. They can explain why Christians call this Good Friday.
- They know that for some Christians today standing up for your faith can risk ridicule and even persecution.

Fantasy Narrative

- Written in first or third person
- Dialogue in differing tenses
- Mainly past tense
- Verbs used to describe actions, thoughts and feelings

- Figurative language - metaphor, simile, personification


We will be answering VIPER style questions.
