Science

As Scientists, we will...

- Know different properties make materials suitable for different uses (properties that can be measured)
- Know materials can be solids, liquids or gases and can explain their properties.
- Know materials can be sorted into groups according to properties including hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity (electrical and thermal) and response to magnets.
- Know that materials made of metal, plastic and rubber are made of a mixture of materials
- Group materials that have different uses according to their properties.
- Sort materials into different groups according to their properties, including hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity, and their response to magnets.
- Explore the mixtures of materials used to create certain metals, plastics, and rubber.

History

As historians, we will:

- Know how to sequence a Tudor timeline from the Battle of Bosworth (1485) to the end of the Tudor dynasty.
- Know who the Tudors were and the time span of the Tudor period.
- Know the last battle of the War of The Roses was known as the Battle of Bosworth and signified the start of the Tudor era.
- Know King Henry VII inaugurated the rule of the house of Tudor over England.
- Know and recall information about Henry VIII and the changes he made to England.
- Know how the religious, political, scientific, and personal beliefs of Henry VIII caused him to behave in a particular way.
- Know how using historical sources build a picture of how Henry VIII lived and reigned.
- Know what life was like for people that lived during the Tudor period.

Maths


As mathematicians, we will:
